

Nature Preserves

Eugene Fargeorge Preserve:

Nine acres of upland and tidal marsh along the Quinnipiac River's eastern shore. Acquired 1986. Location: west side of Quinnipiac Avenue between Route 80 and East Grand Avenue, immediately south of railroad underpass.

Long Wharf Nature Preserve:

Nine acres of shoreline, salt marsh and revegetated fill in the Long Wharf area of New Haven harbor. Features a field of wildflowers and a self-guided tour. Acquired 1994. Location: Long Wharf Drive next to Vietnam Veterans' monument.

Pond Lily:

A freshwater pond and flood plain forest located along the West River, site of a fishway built to restore upstream passage for migrating species. Acquired 1996. Location: Whalley Avenue at junction of Routes 63 and 69, entrance on East Ramsdell.

Quinnipiac Ridge:

Two acres of densely forested rock ridge located in a heavily developed neighborhood between Quinnipiac Avenue and Route 91. Acquired 1998. Location: Quinnipiac Avenue north of Route 80, entrance between 1370 and 1376 Quinnipiac Avenue.

Hemingway Creek:

A small wooded wetland in Fair Haven. Acquired in 1995. Location: east side of Quinnipiac Avenue immediately north of the railroad underpass.

Morris Creek:

Eleven parcels along Morris Creek near Lighthouse Point. Acquired 1986, 1991, 2002, 1993, 2003, 2004. Location: Meadow View Street.

Quinnipiac Meadows:

16.8 acres of tidal wetlands and shrubby uplands bordering the Quinnipiac River's eastern shore. Acquired 1999. Location: see above, about Fargeorge Preserve.
